## Your right to a "Good Faith Estimate"

## You have the right to receive a "Good Faith Estimate" explaining how much your medical care will cost.

Under the law, health care providers need to give patients who don't have insurance or who are not using insurance and estimate of the bill for medical items and services.

- You have the right to receive a Good Faith Estimate for total expected cost of any nonemergency items for services. This includes related cots like medical tests, prescriptions drugs, equipment, and hospital fees.
- Make sure your heath care provider gives you a Good Faith Estimate in writing at least 1
  business day before your medical service or item. You can also ask your health care
  provider, and any other provider you choose, for a Good Faith Estimate before you
  schedule an item or service.
- If you receive a bill that is at least \$400.00 more than your Good Faith Estimate, you can dispute the bill.
- Make sure to save a copy or picture of your Good Faith Estimate.
